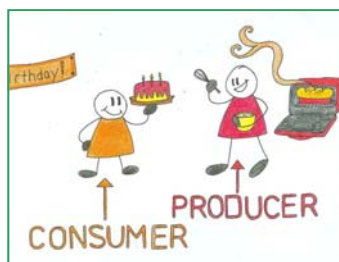

Nora Elementary School principal **Suzanne Zybert** was the recipient of the 2011 **Lawrence Senesh Award for School Administrators**. Nora Elementary is part of MSD Washington Township. Suzanne has been a tireless supporter of economic education, both as a teacher and also as a principal. For example, last year's Olin Davis statewide award winner, **Sally Ball**, was a teacher at Nora Elementary. The award is named after Lawrence Senesh, former Purdue University professor, who was the first professor of economics education in the United States. Dr. Senesh, a pioneer of curriculum design in economics, developed the idea that children can learn the fundamentals of economics as early as first grade.

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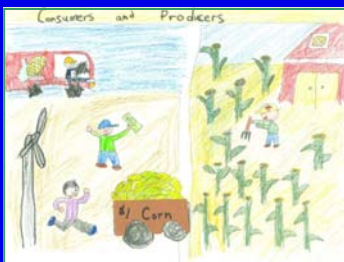

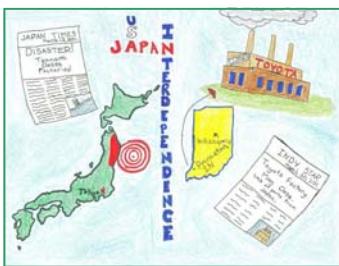
